In our edition of Satur-In our edition of Saturday, November 13th, 1976 we named the makers of this film as a team from Granada Television's "WORLD IN ACTION" and further that that this group stated that this group were "allegedly financed by the Soviet Union in a plot to discreain Hongkong and embarrass

GRANADA TELEVISION POPE we named as participants in this alleged plot Producer GAVIN MACFADYEN, Film Crew RICHARD POPE and ROBERT ALCOCK and Translator WENDY LAM PUI FONG.

"The STAR" accepts that the above allegations were grossly defamatory and wholly unfounded and untrue in respect of the company and of all four persons named and we now wish to withdraw them unreservedly. We realise that such allegations of political bias and secret involvement with a foreign government are very damaging to a company such as GRANADA very damaging to a com-pany such as GRANADA TELEVISION and to in-dividuals such as GAVIN MACFADYEN, RICHARD

OKANADA TELEVISION POPE and ROBERT we named as participants ALCOCK, who are also in this alleged plot engaged in objective Producer GAVIN reporting and film-making in many countries.

We also realise that our allegations caused unnecessary distress and embarrassment to WENDY LAM PUI FONG and to her relatives and friends, and aroused un-justified suspicions about her among those with whom she has worked, both in Hongkong and Britain.

"The STAR" attended court yesterday by its Counsel to withdraw all the above allegations up-reservedly and upreservedly and to apologise, and has agreed to pay a total sum of HK\$500,000.00 by way of damages and costs.
