Advice for civil

servants

The Government Park and Playground Keepers' Union yesterday urged civil servants to put forward their views on post-1997 Hongkong.

The secretary-general of the union, Mr Wong Honsum, said civil servants should grasp the opportunity to say what rights they want protected.

He noted that both the Chinese and Hongkong governments had welcomed civil servants expressing their views on 1997.

Mr Wong believes the Sino-British agreement will help allay civil servant's worries and boost morale.
