## 20 views offered on watchdog

THE Government had received at least 20 submissions on the role of the ombudsman by the time the consultation exercise on the subject closed yesterday.

Four submissions came from social and political groups while the others were submitted by individuals.

A government spokes-man said the submissions focused mainly on the expansion of the Commissioner for Administrative Complaints' jurisdiction, the referral system, the finality of the ombudsman's decisions and the publication of reports.

alyse views contained in the submissions and discuss them with the Legislative Council ad hoc group studying the review of the relevant ordinance.

"The Government will then submit its findings and recommendations to the Executive Council for a final decision," the spokesman

said.

"Subject to the Exco endorsement, the relevant legislative amendment to the ordinance will be tabled to the Legco early next year."

Administrative Complaints, Mr Arthur Garcia, would not comment on whether he

not comment on whether he was satisfied with the number of submissions.

"It depends very much on the quality of the submissions. But I have not been able to see the comments yet," he said.
