## 10-year tenants 174 urged to speak up

People who have been ten-ants of public housing es-tates for more than 10 years have been urged to clarify their income status with the Housing Authority.

Otherwise, the Housing Authority may classify them as being well-off tenants.

The chairman of the Committee on Housing Subsidy, Mr F.K. Hu, said this yesterday after touring Wanchai District.

Tenants should inform the Housing Authority and the said of the sai

Housing Authority six months before new rents are introduced.

The authority has said it intends raising the rents of better-off tenants and a Green Paper on the new policy is to be published at the end of the month.

The proposal is that better-off public housing tenants of more than 10 years' standing will have their rents

doubled.

"It is the responsibility of the tenants themselves to prove they are not the better-off ones," Mr Hu said.

The Housing Authority will not do the job for them, he stressed.

At present, the monthly income limits for public housing applicants range from \$2,700 for a single person to \$7,000 for a family of 10 or more.

If average family income exceeds by 1½ times the limit imposed on waiting list applicants, they will be classified as better-off ten-

ants.

Mr Hu stressed that tenants r riu stressed that tenants giving false information would be deprived of the right to live in their flats. They might also be prose-cuted under the Public Housing Ordinance, he said.

The proposed rental policy aims to encourage wealthier tenants to buy their own

homes.

The policy is expected to be implemented in the middle of next year after con-sultation with the district boards, mutual-aid committees, residents' associations and other organisations

Commenting on the develop-ment of Wanchai District, Mr Hu said that it was important for traine tactities to keep pace with development.

He noted that urban develop-

ment was needed for Wan-chai West, the older part

of the district. Mr Hu was one three Umelco members who visited Wanchai. Mrs Selina Chow and Mr Yeung Pokwan were also present

They were accompanied by the chairman of Wanchai District Board, Mrs Peggy Lam, the District Officer, Mr Roger Garcia, the district board members and other senior government officials.
