\$563,000 a year for bed at BMH

DIRECTOR of Medical and Health, Dr Thong Kah-leong, said yesterday he did not know how the cost of a bed in the British Military Hospital is calculated when patients are transferred there

by the government.

But the actual charges

But the actual charges work out to be in the region of a staggering \$563,000 for a bed per year, he said.

This is in sharp contrast with the relatively cheaper cost of maintaining a bed in government general hospitate, which is about \$200,000 a year in 1983-84.

Dr Thong gave the figures in reply to questions by members of the Finance Committee on government expenditures for the new financial year and the annual cost of maintaining a bed in tmancial year and the annual cost of maintaining a bed in government hospitals, subvented hospitals and in the British Military Hospital.

It is noted that \$24 mil-

lion will be given to the British Military Hospital in British Military Hospital in 1984-85 in respect of up to 80 beds at a cost of \$1,500 perbed per day. The consultation services are also charged at \$480 per out-patient attendance for ante-natal and post-natal cases; and \$596 per out-patient attendance for general cases.

This is a 10 per cent increase over the \$22.2 million for 1983-84.

Dr Thong told the committee that the average cost of hospital beds in government hospitals was calculated in accordance with the bases

in accordance with the bases and standards outlined in the overnment's "Costing Manual".

"Thus, in accordance with these standards and bases, the annual cost of maintaining a bed in government general hospitals in 1983/84 has been approximately \$200,000," he said.

But for subvented hospitals, the same bases and standards could not be used, Dr

Thong said.

Therefore, it is not possible to produce "meaningful" figures which are comparable

figures which are comparable to those provided in respect of the government hospitals. "The cost of a bed in the British Military Hospital is not known as we are not ware of how this is calculated.

Based on the actual charges made by the British Military Hospital in respect of beds made available to government patients, the government patients, the cost of a bed in the British Hospital is approximately \$563,000," he said.

The medical chief stresded that it would not be

sed that it would not be feasible to make a compari-son of the cost of a bed in each of the three types of

hospitals.
