Abode campaigner lobbies UK opposition

VETERAN campaigner Elsie Elliot Tu will host a lunch today for 20 British and European MPs in the English seaside town of Brighton as part of the Honour Hongkong Campaign.

The Legislative Councillor, together with the managing director of Cathay Pacific, Mr Peter Sutch, are due to address the MPs, who are in Brighton for the Labour Party conference.

The Honour Hongkong Campaign has targeted the conference as an op-

portunity to persuade members of Britain's biggest opposition party that Hongkong British citizens should be given the right of abode in the UK.

Mr Sutch is due to host a reception later this evening in Brighton for about 50 to 60 invited guests to explain the Honour Hongkong Campaign's position on the nationality issue.

A spokesman for the Honour Hongkong Campaign said leading journalists and other opinion-makers

had been invited to attend.

Omelco is co-ordinating its own campaign with the Honour Hongkong Campaign group.

It is intended that while they are in Brighton, Mrs Tu and Mr Sutch will hold a number of question and answer sessions.

In Hongkong the lobby group has issued a newsletter to businessmen and other groups who have shown an interest in the campaign.
