The Jockey Club was contributing \$82.5 million and there was \$12.5 million from the Queen's Silver Jubilee Fund.

The \$200,000 donation from Mobil (HK) was to-wards weight and strength training equipment and was the first donation from the commercial sector.

He hoped it was an example other public and private corporations would follow.

The centre has now added

another tennis coach and a seventh swimming coach, said

Mr Li.
"The public demand for their services has been over-

whelming.
"Further coaches will be "Further coaches will be recruited in line with the planned and controlled expansion of the centre," he said.

"As the coaching team grows, local talent in Hong-kong should benefit more and more from its expertise and

The centre could become one of Hongkong's major training amenities in the next few years with the support of the Government, Jockey Club and local sports community, he said.
