THE Urban Council is to undertake a mammoth programme of projects over the gramme of projects over the next five years, following approval by its Capital Works Select Committee of spending of \$2.7 billion on new facilities.

A total of 123 facilities would be built in urban areas during the period, according to the council's

plan.

The capital works programme covers a wide range of projects including market complexes, indoor games halls, parks and playgrounds as well as cultural venues, according to committee chairman, Mr Pao Ping-

wing.
"To ensure an even distribution of these facilities to meet increasing demands, the council will start in May its annual exercise of con-sulting all urban district boards on the relative priority of district projects so that a more realistic works programme can be formulated," said Mr Pao.
