## Appointed councillors head attendance list

THE elected Urban Councillors have been lagging behind the Governor-appointees in their attendance records on the 40-member municipal assembly.

The 15 appointed members scored an average attendance rate of 94.8 per cent from when the council's current session began three years ago until last month.

The tallies for Urbco's 10 district board representatives and 15 directly-elected members stood at 89.8 per cent and 86.8 per cent respectively.

The Shamshuipo District Board's nominee in Urbco, lawyer Mr Ambrose Cheung Wing-sum, was at the bottom of the list with a 63.8 per cent attendance rate.

He was unavailable for comment.

Others who fell below the 70 per cent mark include two directly-elected councillors, Mr Frederick Fung Kin-kee, and solicitor Mr Daniel Wong Kwok-tung.

Mr Wong, who is seeking a second term in Yau Tsim, said many Urbco meetings just dealt with routine matters and were a waste of time and resources.

He turned up at 126 of his 190 expected meetings. The number of expected meetings excludes those in which members have served a notification of absence.

"There are some overlaps in the committees' functions. The council should be streamlined to reduce its number of meetings," Mr Wong said.

Mr Fung, 38, on the other hand, attended 93 out of his 136 expected meetings.

He attributed this to his iocal involvement in support of the 1989 student povement in Beijing.

Mr Fung, a post-graduate

student at the Chinese University, said his examinations also prevented him from attending more meetings

"Clashes may also arise from handling cases of public complaints. I attach priority to the residents' well being over attending meetings," he said, adding that his ward office had handled 660 cases from 1989 to 1991.

However, veteran councillor Mrs Elsie Tu, who runs the most popular ward office handling about 1,600 cases a year, has attended more meetings than she was supposed to.

An elected Urbco member since 1963 and also a legislator, Mrs Tu attended 146 meetings, 11 more than expected.

She said she had to attend a monthly average of 60 meetings, including her ward office session.

"There are only occasional clashes between the Legislative and Urban Council meetings. Most Urbco meetings begin at 8.30 am, they seldom clash with those in Legco, which normally start in the afternoon," the school supervisor said.

Seven other appointed members — chairman Mr Gerry Forsgate, vice-chairman Mr Stephen Lau Manlung, Mr Tong Kam-biu, Mr Samuel Wong Ping-wai, Mr Lo King-man, Mr Paul Young Tze-kong and Mr Jason Yuen King-yuk — also attended extra meetings.

Mr Mok Ying-fan, who is seeking a second term in Wong Tai Sin South, admitted he did not attend the meetings between last January to March because of his district board election campaign.

He attended 114 of his 152 expected meetings, adding that it was not easy for councillors with dual memberships to fare well in both.

A government spokesman said councillors who were absent for three consecutive meetings without a reason would be disqualified. So far, no-one has been expelled in this way. The number of expected

can vary because there is no hard-and-fast rule on how many committees and working parties a councillor must join, she said.

Members are free to join the assembly's standing committee of the whole council, 11 select committees, and 18 sub-committees and working parties.

Meanwhile, the Urban and Regional Councils have printed 1.8 million copies of a leaflet outlining their work for electors in the May 5 elections to the two assemblies.
