LIVESTOCK farmers forced out of business by tough anti-pollution controls are to be paid \$541 million in

compensation over 10 years.
The amount is to compensate farmers affected

by the 10-year livestock waste control scheme, which was implemented in 1987.

Legislators yesterday approved two sums of \$71 million and \$99.9 million for exception of the control of th gratia allowances for this and the next financial year,

which have been included in the \$541 million package. Defending the need for

additional funds, the administration said that estimates istration said that estimates were first made using a 1979 livestock census and the assumption that only 30 per cent of farmers would apply for ex gratia allowances.

However, this had been superseded by a 1987 survey and a new estimate that 50 per cent of farmers would opt for the handout.
