## The readworks for Junk Bay

WORK on a new \$60 million road network in Junk Bay, will begin at the end of this

year.

The project manager of the Junk Bay New Town Development Office, Mr Jef-Development Office, Mr Jer-frey Thomas, speaking at a Saikung District Board meet-ing yesterday, said the new roadworks will be carried out in Aptsai peninsula and in Yauyuewan.

"The new roads will provide vehicular and pedestrian access to Yauyuewan Village in area 22, the public housing estates in area 23 and other new developments at the head of Junk Bay," Mr Thomas said.

Construction work, he said, is expected to be completed in September 1986 to coincide with the moving in of the first batch of public housing estate tenants in link line. Junk Day.

The roadworks will involve:

• The construction of a

section of a new road, a dual carriageway with two lanes running in each direction, from area 22 of Yauyuewan to area 23 in Aptsai penin-sula sula.

- The construction of a section of a new single dual carriageway road extending all the way behind Yauyuewan village and the construction of a connecting single carriageway to the village resite area of Yauyuewan and adjoining government facilities.
- The construction of subway systems at road junctions.

only two lanes will be constructed under the first stage. The others, with their ancillary works, will be constructed at a later date to cope with development requirements of the new town.

Mr Thomas said the construction work will not affect residents as large parts of the roads will be built on reclaimed land.
