Yesterday morning, representatives of the shopowners, accompanied by Mrs Elliott, met Jockey Club officials to voice their objections to the betting centre, planned to be set up at the entrance of the Hong King shopping arcade in Yilun Street.

On Monday, more than 30 shopowners stopped workmen from sealing off one of the four entrances to the shop-ping arcade for the betting centre.

The shopowners said these entrances are the building's main fire exits.
