**POLICE** have arrested seven members of a radical Revolutionary Marxist youth group in connection with their protest to the Xinhua Newsagency over the Tienanmun incident on Ching Ming Day.

The youths were released each on \$500 self recognisance after questioning and they are required to report to Causeway Bay Police Station this Friday.

Their colleagues last night went to the police station after their arrest and demanded the release of the youths.

The group was told by the duty officer that the youths had already left the station.

The group then read out a protest note and dispersed.

## 7 young radicals held over protest

Earlier, policemen were deployed at various points at Victoria Park where the group planned to hold a mass rally to denounce China over the alleged suppression of the Tienanmun incident.

Police officers, who had photographs of some youths arrested on sight the suspects as they identified them.

Some of the youths were arrested even before they entered

the park and one was arrested outside the Xinhua Newsagency's Queen's Road East office.

A police spokesman said the arrest was made in connection with the earlier incident on April 5 when the youths staged a protest outside the agency.

He said they decided to take action yesterday after seeking advice from the Attorney General.
